- 3. The water is a beautiful shade of rust.** Nope, your eyes are not deceiving you. Orange water is a sure sign of water heater woes. That bright color is actually corrosion from inside the tank, and it may eat right through the walls of your water heater.
- 4. The water heater won't stop crying.** Unless your water heater has morphed into a sentient being, those aren't tears of sadness. Instead, they're most likely water droplets from a hidden leak. You need a plumber to replace your water heater before it causes a flood.
- 5. There's a pond forming at the base.** Don't wait until any ducks fly in and set up permanent residence around your water heater. Standing water is another warning sign of a lurking leak. Only a plumber can resolve this issue.
- 6. The energy company keeps wanting more money.** An efficient water heater shouldn't break the bank. Review any changes in your energy bill carefully to determine if an inefficient unit is to blame. Better yet, save money and get a tankless model.
- 7. Your hot water smells like melted metal.** Is that even possible? Yes, unfortunately, it is. If the tank of your water heater fills up with too many minerals or rust, you can smell it from the tap. You may even taste it, but we don't recommend that you pour yourself a glass of rust water.
